SUPPORTING OUR FAMILIES

As a school, we will soon be sending out information about upcoming school trips & events. These are imperative to our children's extended learning. However, we understand it may put an unnecessary financial strain on our families.

Therefore £1000 PER YEAR GROUP from school funds has been agreed to help subsidize school trips this academic year to lessen the financial burden for parents.

And £600 PER YEAR GROUP donation has once again been agreed with our PTA.

This will be deducted by us before the letters go out to parents. In some cases, for the trip to go ahead, a voluntary contribution of the remaining amount may still be required.

DRINKS IN SCHOOL

We follow the Local Authority and National guidelines which state that children should only have **plain**, **still or sparking water** in school to drink in the classroom. This should be brought into school in a clear container. Bottles are can be provided at the Office. Flavoured water is not recommended under these guidelines. All water from cold taps is of drinking standard in school. **Stanley Mugs & Air Ups are discouraged.**

NUT FREE SCHOOL

We have children in school who suffer from SEVERE nut allergies in school. We cannot stress enough the severity of these allergies that could have <u>very serious results</u> should they even come in to contact with nuts to the touch, let alone digest them. We implore you to empathise and ensure that this must NEVER happen.

The following items SHOULD NOT be brought into school:

- NO packets of nuts
- NO Whitworths mixed nuts sachets
- NO peanut butter sandwiches
- NO Nutella (Chocolate Spread)
- NO pesto on pasta/wraps (made with pine nuts)
- NO fruit and cereal bars that contain nuts
- NO chocolate bars or sweets that contain nuts (Celebrations i.e. Snickers)
- NO sesame seed rolls (children allergic to nuts may also have a severe reaction to sesame)
- NO cakes made with nuts

NO EARRINGS POLICY

We have a very strict no earring policy. Studs are not permitted under any circumstances and if possible will be asked to removed or swapped for clear plastic retainers. If this is not possible your child will not be able to take part in PE or outside playtimes until they are changed over.
