#### The Year 6s have an exciting curriculum planned for them this half term.

#### Music

As musicians, the children in 6ZW will learn how to play ukulele with a specialist teacher from Stockport Music Service. Children in 6CM and 6JL will learn and perform songs with instruments

#### D.T.

As designers, we will be researching toys linked to circuits in order to design, create and evaluate a steady hand game.

#### Science

## **History**

In history, we will be learning about WMI and WW2 and the impact it had on our local area. We will be investigating primary and secondary sources including letters from the front line and propaganda. ### **English**

As readers, we will continue developing our skills to retrieve and infer information from a variety of fiction and non-fiction.

# Computing

As computer programmers, we will be learning how to use spreadsheets; we will be able to navigate around a spreadsheet, using data and formatting cells. Additionally, we will investigate how spreadsheets can automatically create graphs and how we can use formulae to calculate using data.
