


2024 Data Summary



Trends Over Time at Statutory Assessment Points

EYFS



In 2024, from a cohort of 70 pupils, 61.4% achieved a good level of development (GLD), a total of 43 pupils.


The EYFSP good level of development has increased by 5.3% from 56.1% in 2023 to 61.4% in 2024. This is equivalent to approximately 4 more pupils achieving a good level of development in 2024.

The GLD in our school is 6.3% lower than the National average of 67.7%. This is the equivalent of 4 fewer pupils, compared to the National average.

BHPS is in percentile 73 when compared to all schools nationally for a good level of development. Our school rose 9 places in the percentile rankings between 2023 and 2024, from 82 to 73.

Phonics





In 2024, 83.3% of our Year 1 cohort achieved the expected standard in Phonics, 3.1% higher than the National average of 80.2%. This is the equivalent to 2 more pupils in our school achieving the expected standard comparted to the National average.


In Year 2 the expected standard percentage in Phonics increased by 36.2% from 47.1% in 2023 to 83.3% in 2024. This is equivalent to approximately 4 more pupils achieving the expected standard in 2024. Our school is in percentile 17 when compared to all schools nationally for Year 2 expected standard. Our school rose 56 places in the percentile rankings between 2023 and 2024, from 73 to 17.



2024 Data Summary



Key Stage Two



From a cohort of 69 pupils, at the end of Key Stage 2, 68.1% achieved the expected standard in Reading, Writing & Maths combined, a total of 47 pupils. This is 7.2% higher than the National average of 60.9% and equivalent to 5 more pupils achieving in our school compared to the National average.

Our school's expected standard percentage in Reading, Writing & Maths combined has increased by 12.7% from 55.4% in 2023 to 68.1% in 2024. This is equivalent to approximately 9 more pupils achieving the expected standard in 2024.


BHPS is in percentile 35 when compared to all schools nationally for the combined expected standard in Reading, Writing & Maths. We rose 30 places in the percentile rankings between 2023 and 2024, from 65 to 35.


From a cohort of 69 pupils, 78.3% achieved the expected standard in Reading, a total of 54 pupils. 23.2% achieved a higher standard in Reading, a total of 16 pupils. The average scaled score in reading was 105.2

Our expected standard percentage in Reading has increased by 9.1% from 69.2% in 2023 to 78.3% in 2024; equivalent to approximately 6 more pupils achieving.

78.3% achieved the expected standard in Reading in our school, 3.6% higher than the National average of 74.7%.

Our school rose 23 places in the percentile rankings between 2023 and 2024, from 69 to 46.





From a cohort of 69 pupils, 79.7% achieved the expected standard in Writing, a total of 55 pupils. Our school's expected standard percentage in Writing has increased by 12% from 67.7% in 2023 to 79.7% in 2024; equivalent to approximately 8 more pupils achieving. No pupils achieved the Greater Depth Standard in writing; therefore, no pupils achieved the higher standard in all three subjects.

79.7% achieved the expected standard in Writing, 7.6% higher than the National average of 72.1%. This is equivalent to 5 more pupils in our school achieving the expected standard compared to the National average.

Our school is in percentile 31 when compared to all schools nationally for the expected standard in Writing. This is a rise of 39 places in the percentile rankings between 2023 and 2024, from 70 to 31.

From a cohort of 69 pupils, 73.9% achieved the expected standard in Maths, a total of 51 pupils. 15.9% achieved a higher standard in Maths, a total of 11 pupils. The average scaled score in maths was 103.1

73.9% achieved the expected standard in Maths, 0.5% higher than the National average of 73.4%.

Our school is in percentile 55 when compared to all schools nationally for the expected standard in Maths. We rose 24 places in the percentile rankings between 2023 and 2024, from 79 to 55.
