### PLEASE DRIVE & PARK CONSIDERATELY

We would like to acknowledge the vast majority of our parents who drive & park sensibly and considerately around school during drop off and pick up times.

However, there are a small but significant minority of parents from our school who do not.

We appeal to our school community to behave as responsible adults and to The Highway Code & following suggestions:

1. Be mindful of the safety of **all** our children, not only your own
2. Stop parking on or across our neighbours' drives
3. Stop parking on double yellow lines outside school
4. Stop using the staff car park at the start and end of the day
5. Be respectful to our neighbours and each other when parking and driving during pick up and drop of times

**The Police & Stockport Council Road Safety Department traffic enforcement officers will continue to be present at school on an adhoc basis.**

We would like to remind all parents and carers that the main concern around parking at the school for all of us should be **the safety of your children.**
