As the nights start to draw in we are fully aware of the worry that is on **all** our minds; the increased cost of living.

As a school, it is fantastic to finally be able to get the children out and about on school trips & events again, after COVID restricted us for so long. These are imperative to our children's extended learning. However, we understand it may put an unnecessary strain on our families.

We realise how easy it can be for new parents to get lost in abbreviations so here is a quick breakdown that might help:

Nursery:

Apples - Monday, Tuesday & Wednesday morning

Pears - Wednesday afternoon, Thursday & Friday

Fruit Salads - All day, all week (& mixture of apples & pears!)

Further up the school the letters and numbers are just class year groups & teacher's names:

RBW = Reception Mrs. B.Worsley

1CH = Year 1 Miss. C.Heywood

6AB = Year 6 Mr. A.Bagguley and so on and so forth...

EYFS stands for **Early Years Foundation Stage** & comprises of Nursery & the 3 Reception classes

KS1 stands for **Key Stage 1** (Year 1 & 2)

KS2 stands for **Key Stage 2** (Years 3-6)

LKS2 = Lower Key Stage 2 which is only Year 3 & 4

UKS2 = Upper Key Stage 2 which is Year 5 & 6

...and **SLT** - stands for **Senior Leadership Team** which is the Headteacher, Deputy, and Heads of EYFS, KS1, LKS2 & UKS2.

DRINKS IN SCHOOL

At Broadstone Hall Primary School, we follow the Local Authority and National guidelines which state that children should only have **plain, still or sparkling water** in school to drink in the classroom. This should be brought into school in a clear container. Flavoured water is not recommended by the Local Authority and National guidelines for children to drink in school. All water from cold taps is of drinking standard in school.

We also recommend that children bring water in clearly labelled multi use containers, rather than single use bottles which are not good for the environment.
